Uniforms

Parents and Guardians are reminded that all learners are to be correctly attired in their formal school uniforms. In the last newsletter a leniency period was given up until the 22nd of February, whereby parents could order and purchase their child's uniform. When we resume school on 7 May, learners are to wear their regulatory winter school uniform.

School Uniform Combinations:






Parents are requested to ensure that their child/children wear their school uniform in the correct combination.

Formal School attire includes:

- Regulatory long navy trousers for boys and girls with the school cream long-sleeve shirt or cream short-sleeve shirt.
- All formal attire can be worn with the regulatory blaser / or school navy jersey. Please note that tracksuit tops **cannot** be worn with formal wear.
- Tracksuit tops can only be worn with tracksuit pants and plain white takkies before or after sporting events or travelling to school camps.
- Girls' formal school attire may include the regulatory tunic or skirt, which may be worn with the school cream long-sleeve or short- sleeve shirt.
- Boys' formal school attire may include the regulatory navy shorts which may be worn with the cream long-sleeve or short- sleeve shirt.





- The school tie may only be worn with the cream long-sleeve shirt. The shirt must be fully buttoned to the top.
- School navy socks are to be worn with the formal school attire.
- Black laced school shoes are to be worn by boys and laced or buckled black school shoes worn by girls.

Summer Uniform:

- **Boys:** School navy shorts or navy trousers with cream shirt, navy socks and black laced school shoes, school tie may be worn.
- **Girls:** School skirt, tunic or navy trousers with cream shirt, navy socks and black laced or buckled school shoes. School school tie may be worn.

Winter Uniform:

- **Boys:** School navy trousers with cream shirt, regulatory navy socks and black laced school shoes. Regulatory school tie may be worn.
- **Girls:** School skirt, tunic or navy trousers with ream shirt, navy socks or navy stockings and black laced or buckled school shoes. School tie may be worn.

Early Years Uniform:

- **Boys:** School navy shorts with burgundy golfer, school socks and plain black or white takkies.
- **Girls:** School regulatory skorts with burgundy golfer, navy school socks and plain black or white takkies.
- **Girls and Boys:** School tracksuit pants and tracksuit jacket with burgundy golfer, navy school socks and plain black or white takkies.

Girls and Boys Hair Policy:

We extend our gratitude to all parents for their unwavering support in upholding the school's hair policy. As emphasised during our Parent Information Evenings, we recognise the diversity of opinions when it comes to haircut regulations, acknowledging that personal preferences vary. To promote uniformity among our students, we believe that the enforcement of this policy is crucial in fostering a safe and inclusive learning environment for all. Please familiarise yourself with the following guidelines:

Boys:

- Hair must be maintained at a uniform length or completely shaved. Hair may not be touching the collar or grown over the ears and fringes may not grow past the eyebrow.
- Layering of hair is not permitted.
- Hair must be of the naturally occurring hair colours. Highlights and graded dyeing are not permitted.
- No decorative beads and braiding of hair permitted.

Girls:

- Hair must be well-maintained and kept off the face.
- Hair must be of the naturally occurring hair colours. Highlights and graded dyeing are not permitted.
- Hair must be fastened back when at the length to do so. No fringes longer than the eyebrows.
 - Only these non-decorative hair accessories are permitted in the following colours: navy blue, burgundy or black hair elastics, navy blue, burgundy or black alice bands and or plain clips. No decorative beads are permitted.







Lost Property:

There are unclaimed school clothing items, water bottles, and lunch boxes in the lost property area. We kindly request parents to visit the designated lost property table located in the dining area. To expedite the process of item retrieval, we urge you to ensure that all school clothing, water bottles, and lunch boxes are clearly labelled with your child's full name and surname. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated and helps us efficiently manage lost items. Thank you for your support.

Aftercare

A gentle reminder that the Primary School aftercare facility is accessible for your convenience until 16h30. We kindly request that you ensure your child/children is/are collected no later than 17h00.

It is disconcerting to observe the consistent lateness in picking up children from school, leading to excessively long days for our learners who are fatigued by the end of a demanding school day. It is important to note that this facility has consistently been made available to our parents free of charge, understanding the commitments of working parents. We urge parents to also consider the teachers who remain on duty and similarly have families to attend to.

In the interest of ensuring reasonable pick-up times, we may need to consider implementing a structured fee system for after-school care in the future. Your cooperation and support as parents on this matter are greatly appreciated.

We wish our Bradfordian parents and learners safe travels over the holiday period and we look forward to seeing your return on 07 May, at the start of Term 2.
